

The classes are very small, generally 1 professor teaches about 10 students.

There are a number of extracurricular programs. For example the exchange programs with 26 international partner universities, where you can do a semester overseas. Another is the Host Family Program which allows foreign students to stay with German families to learn more about the culture and lifestyle of Germans.

The application requirements are a High School diploma, an SAT or ACT, an English test, and other recommendations.

Jacobs University

Jacobs University is a private, non-profit university located in Bremen and was founded in 2001. The University has a strong international perspective, which means that you can study after your Bachelor degree at an Ivy League University like Harvard, Yale or Oxford. There are many students from all over the world at Jacobs as well; over 1300 students from 100 countries.

The first focus of Jacobs University is Mobility, the movement of people, goods and information. The courses included are math, programming and logistics and industrial engineering.

Another focus of Jacobs University is Health. These courses focus on bioactive substances and understanding the world. There are two departments in which the subjects are split; they are called Life Sciences and Chemistry, and Physics and Earth Sciences. The departments in the Health area have made scientific discoveries like their work on detecting and diagnosing cancer cells in the body.

The third area of focus at Jacobs is Diversity, studying how our societies formed and how the individual fits into society. The individual is thought to be a biological, psychological and socially determined being, which basically means that people are made of 3 things: the mind, body and their perception of the world.
