


Location

Some Facts

The university was orginally founded as the Roman Catholic University of Commerce of Tilburg in 1927 but this religious aspect faded away over time. The total number of students at the University amounts to 12.399 in total. There are 1.563 foreign students from 102 different nationalities form a share of 10% which is steadily increasing. Of the 69 bachelor and master programs 37 are taught in English. Over the course of its existince the university has provided knowledge to over 60.00 alumni. Also the Journal of European Economic Association ranked the Tilburg Faculty of Economics and Business Administration #1 in Europe.

Schools

- Tilburg School of Economics and Management is the heart of the University with 5.600 students and is the oldest of the Schools
- Tilburg Law School is highly ranked among international law schools and accommodates 3.000
 Students
- Tilburg School of Social and Behavioral Sciences offers a variety of pschological and socialogical studies to currently 2.500 students
- Tilburg School of Humanities combines studies in culture, philosophy and language with the digital future
- Tilburg School of Catholic Theology picks up on the catholic heritage of Tilburg

Studying Abroad

The Netherlands are well known for their international society and culture. Students from foreign countries are a common sight at dutch Universities and there are various options for students from abroad to study at a dutch University. An aspect that appeals to most foreign students is the dutch way of application. Dutch law forbids the Universities to only accept students based on their grades. With all Tilburg University courses it is possible to study one year abroad while getting accreditation for the courses taken. However it is to be considered that in the Netherlands Studies are only partially subsidised by the government and tuition fees around 2.000 Euros per year are to be expected.
