Employee Profile

Tiago is from Lisbon where he studied electrical engineering at university. Within university he actually participated in the Erasmus Programme, doing a 6 month mechatronic internship in Eindhoven.

The first company he worked for was 'National Oilwell Varco' as a PLC engineer. He worked in this company for 11 months, 3 of which he was stationed in Norway.

Afterwards he decided to apply at Vanderlande due to his 6 months experience in Eindhoven previously with Erasmus. From the time of our visit he had only worked in Vanderlande 9 months but is planning to stay on for 2-3 more years.

His job is to work closely with a particular part of a larger airport system such as unloading or sorting baggage and code the machinery to do as it is meant to. In the future he hopes to do a Master's degree in Electrical Engineering and therefore will be moving away from the Netherlands to do so.



History

Vanderlande was founded by Eddie van der Lande in 1949 in the Dutch town of Veghel. The founding family initially modernized and later produced machines for the textile industry. Afterwards they started manufacturing machines for transporting goods.

In 1963 Vanderlande went into a partnership with the American company Rapistan Incorporated, which influenced the development of the company. They invented customised transport systems that enabled them to be successfull all over the world.

In 1988 the current owner NPM Capital purchased the majority of the company's shares, Vanderlande was able to operate globally afterwards. Vanderlande has 260 projects in 105 countries.


The company has developed a lot, nowadays it is one of the main international companies in the fields of sorting systems for parcel services and automated material handling solutions for airports and warehouses.

Facts and Figures

- Vanderlande's baggage handling systems move 3.2 billion pieces of luggage around the world per year, which are 8.8 million pieces per day. These systems are active in 600 different airports and on 14 of the world's top 20 airports
- More than 20 million parcels, equating to 300 packages per second, are sorted by Vanderlande's systems every day for a variety of customers including the four largest parcel and postal companies in the world.
- 12 of Europe's Top-20 e-commerce companies and many distribution firms use any of the Vanderlande handling systems. The company is also a leading supplier of warehouse automation solutions.
- Vanderlande is active in 105 countries. In addition to their headquarters in Veghel, they have sales offices, service organisations and representatives in 23 countries across the world providing local support.
